

## **ZEP Briefing – 138 project proposals received under the Innovation Fund**

## **Background**

The European Commission received 138 project proposals after the Innovation Fund <u>closed</u> its second call for large-scale projects on 3 March 2022. A total of €1.5 billion is to be made available for projects supporting the European Green Deal. On 11 March, the Commission <u>reported</u> that the project submissions represented €12.1 billion in requested funding.

The proposals received are covering the following sectors:

- Renewable Energy Sources: 13
- Energy Storage: 21
- Energy Intensive Industries: 104 (including Carbon Capture, Use and Storage and hydrogen)

Most applications are located in Spain, but countries such as France, Germany, and the Netherlands, also see significant interest.

## Next steps

The Commission will now verify the admissibility of all submissions ahead of approval. External evaluators will back the evaluation process, which will consider three main criteria:

- the degree of innovation;
- projected greenhouse gas emission reductions and maturity; and

scalability and cost efficiency.

Results are expected by Q3 2022, and grants will be awarded by Q4 2022. Under the first large-scale call, seven projects were picked by the Commission to receive funding – with four of the seven employing significant CCS and/or CCU elements.
